



MIGHTY HOOPLA – SATURDAY 8TH JUNE 2019 CROSS THE TRACKS – SUNDAY 9TH JUNE 2019 BROCKWELL PARK, HERNE HILL

This leaflet is to give you some information about the Mighty Hoopla and Cross The Tracks events taking place in Brockwell Park on 8th and 9th June 2019. We have outlined the steps we are taking to minimise the events impact on local residents, and how to get in touch with us during the event period.

EVENT SET UP & SITE ARRANGEMENTS

Preparations for Mighty Hoopla and Cross The Tracks begin on Thursday 30th May. The dismantling of the event is scheduled to be complete by Sunday 16th June, after which the organisers will hand the site back to the council. Prior to handover we will ensure that all remaining public spaces are clean and returned to the best possible standard.

A key pathway crossing between the tennis courts and Brockwell Hall will still be accessible during the majority of this time from 8am-8pm, only closing for safety and security reasons on Friday 7th – Monday 10th June.

SOUND MANAGEMENT

The organisers are required to make sure that the noise from the events is controlled to limits agreed with the local authority. A team of noise consultants monitor levels on both the Lambeth and Southwark side of the park. The sound systems will be tested the day prior to the events taking place to ensure that they do not break the noise limits on the license. There will be a further brief period of testing on the morning of the event. TRAFFIC

It has been agreed during the planning of the event to put in place a temporary road closure on event days to enable the safe and controlled movement of large number of pedestrians towards public transport. The following closures will be implemented over the two show days:

For arriving audience - closures (estimated 1100 – 0000)

- Arlingford Road (at its junction with Brailsford Road)
- Railton Road (From junction with Rymer Street to junction with Dulwich Road)

For departing audience - closures (estimated 2030 - 0000)

- Morval Road (at its junction with Effra Road)
- Brixton Water Lane (at its junction with Dalberg Road & Effra Parade)
- Norwood Road (at its junction with Croxted Road)
- Railton Road (at its junction with Regent Street)
- Dulwich Road (at its junction with Regent Road)
- Dulwich Road (at its junction with Rymer Street)

• Dulwich Road (at its junction with Half Moon Lane)

Resident Only Access

The following roads will have resident-only access during the egress phase (20:30 – 00:00). In order to get through these road closures, residents will need to show an original copy of this letter to the steward at the access point.

- Hurst Street
- Rymer Street
- Railton Road (from junction with Regent Road)
- Arlingford Road
- Trelawn Road

There will be parking restrictions on Effra Road, Morval Road, Brixton Water Lane, Dalberg Road, Milkwood Road, and Norwood Road.

IMPACT OF THE EVENT

The event organisers have worked extensively with the Local Authority Event Planning Group to ensure that the impact of the event on residents is minimised. A safe egress plan has been developed to manage the impact on the surrounding areas.

The egress plans include the cleaning and waste removal from the surrounding streets, and temporary toilets positioned at key locations along the exit routes for the audience leaving the park each night. The event itself will be provided with adequate toilet facilities for the number of people that are likely to attend. During the event, the organisers will work closely with the police and other statutory bodies, meeting regularly to respond quickly and effectively to issues raised by residents.
