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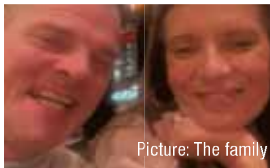

'There was a machine gun at my head'

TERRIFIED GRANDPARENTS RELIVE HORRIFYING POLICE RAID AT HOME

Two grandparents said they and their grandchildren no longer feel safe in their home after armed police burst through their front door and pointed guns at them with no explanation.

John Southon, 54, was followed by armed Met officers on November 16 to Brixton Tube station where he was kicked in the back of the leg and then arrest-

ed on "gun offences". While being arrested, Mr Southon claims an armed police officer fell over him and he now has injuries to his back and shoulder which have seen him signed off from work.

"I felt the kick in my leg and heard shouting then saw there was a machine gun pointed at my head," said Mr Southon.

While being arrested his keys

£20k to find killer of two men at shooting

A reward of up to £20,000 is on offer for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the person responsible for a shooting near Brixton that saw two young men killed.

Guilherme Messias da Silva, 21, a delivery driver who was finishing his shift, was hit by a car and suffered fatal injuries at around 7.50pm on October 30.

Another man, Lemar Urquhart, 27, a Drill rapper known as Perm, was shot dead.

Detectives believe two cars were in the Railton Road area when one of the cars collided with Guilherme's moped before further colliding with parked vehicles nearby.

Guilherme, the moped driver, died at the scene. Lemar left his vehicle and was pursued by a gunman from the second car. It was at this point that Lemar was shot and killed. The gunman then jumped into the second car and fled the scene.

On November 8, a 25-year-old man was arrested on suspicion of manslaughter. He was taken to an east London police station and is bailed to return at a date in mid-December.

CLAPHAM COMMON 2023 Events
Application (1)

The London Borough of Lambeth is applying to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs for consent under Article 12 of the Greater London Parks and Open Spaces Order 1967 to carry out restricted works on Clapham Common. The Planning Inspectorate will decide the application on behalf of the Secretary of State.

The proposed works are for the creation of temporary event sites on Clapham Common for a series of public entertainment, leisure and recreational sporting events in 2023. Temporary fencing and event structures (including event stages, marquees, funfair rides, concession stands, event gantries, gazebos, toilets and welfare facilities, back of house cabins and plant enclosures) will be onsite for the events for a total duration of 122 days in 2023.

The fencing and structures will be located on the following areas of the common:

- The area referred to as 'Event Site' located at the northeast of Clapham Common accessible from Long Road. (Luna Cinema, Moonwalk, Oktoberfest)
- Area between Long Pond and Windmill Drive located at the east of Clapham Common. (Colourscape)
- Using the gravel Redgra sports pitches on the west side of the common, adjacent to the A205. (CRUK Race for Life, Pretty Muddy)
- Area referred to as 'Funfair Site' located on the west of Clapham Common, west of Mount Pond. (Run Through races, George Irvin's Funfair)
- Clapham Common 'Southside Site' located at the south of Clapham Common bordered by Clapham Common Southside, Nightingale Lane, Nightingale Walk & the Avenue. (British Heart Foundation London to Brighton Bike Ride / Skyline Bike London to Brighton Bike Ride)

Heras style fencing will be a maximum of 700 metres in length for each onsite event. The heras style fencing will be a maximum of 2 metres in height. For some events, 1.1 meter high pedestrian barriers (crowd control barriers) will make up a section of the event site or area of fence line. The fencing will enclose the temporary event sites safely and will include public and staff entrances, including fire exits.

Please note this application for Common Land Consent does not cover the 2024 Festival Republic Summer event, which is the subject of a separate application for Common Land Consent on Clapham Common, which will be known as Application (2).
