## 'Losing my brother is like losing right hand'

FUNDRAISER STARTED TO RETURN BODY TO INDIA

The family of a man who was stabbed to death over the weekend have compared losing him to "losing your right hand," as they try to bring his body home to be buried. Aravind Sasikumar, 38, was stabbed to death in the early hours of Friday morning at his home in Southampton Way, Camberwell. His younger brother, Sekhar Sasikumar, 30, who lives in Northampton, said "he loved this country," and that he was close to getting his UK citizenship.

"We were very close. If anything happened he was the first person I would call," said Sekhar. "You never think this will happen to you. "I went to identify him and it was like he was just sleeping there. It didn't make any sense. I couldn't stand there for long."

Aravind's family want to return him to his home city of Kochi, India. They are fundraising to transport his body and need £25,000 to ensure he gets there. A post-mortem confirmed he

### 'We don't have enough cash to build the homes'

A town hall housing boss has confessed a council doesn't have the cash to start 11,000 council homes it promised. Southwark council housing director Michael Scorer admitted the council only has the money to construct 3,200 of the 11,000 council homes it has pledged to begin by 2043. Speaking to MPs on Monday, Mr Scorer said the commitment was one of the biggest financial challenges facing the council in terms of social housing.

He said: "We've got a commitment that's unfunded to build 11,000 council homes. We've got about 3,200 that we can fund at the moment, which is less than we would like to."

Mr Scorer said the council was already borrowing as much as it could safely do to fund projects and was "struggling for Government help".

Conditions attached to many grants prevented the council from being able to use them, Mr Scorer told the Levelling Up, Housing and Communities committee.

Mr Scorer said the council faced a bill of £30million per year for the next three years for safety works on its properties and would have to fork out £800million over the next 10 years on making homes more eco-friendly.
